Forest Conservation Easements are the Topic of Workshop

workshop on the subject of Conservation Easements for woodlot owners and farmers on

Featured speakers include Joanne Riccitelli, formerly the Land Protection

Health Works Project, who will address the basics of Conservation Easements. That

includes the value and benefits of conservation easements for land conservation, as well

as the ability of property owners to continue working the family farm or woodlot, and

pass the land on down to future generations, while protecting the land from future

development.

There will also be a panel of landowners who will share their experience with this process, including West Greenwich Town Manager Kevin Breene.
